- We deliver our programmes via a **combination of teaching** at Residentials and at local learning centres (Hubs started in 2009).
- Our modules are taught by expert academic practitioners who are actively involved in ministry, mission, and business worldwide.
- Our programmes are delivered in partnership with the local church.
- On our validated programmes, students receive a university degree/certificate.
- We also offer a fully online, non-validated Level 3, one-year Foundations in Theology Course.



15 VEARS OF HUB

WTC delivers its programmes throughout the UK in **learning** and worshipping communities at various locations called Hubs, so you can study while remaining at home.

Hubs meet on either **Monday or Tuesday evenings** from 6.30-9.30pm for 22 weeks per year (undergraduate programmes).

- Each Hub has a Hub Director who is responsible for facilitating the creation of a worshipping and learning community.
- Face to face and video conferenced teaching take place in your learning community.
- Time and space is given to discuss the issues arising in the teaching.
- Meaningful relationships are formed with fellow students.
- Physical and e-book and e-article Hub Libraries and other academic resources.



Indergraduate PROGRAMMES

CertHE in Kingdom Theology

This **2 year part-time certificate** is open to those with A-levels, Scottish Highers, or equivalents who meet the entry requirements. For those without these formal qualifications we will consider work and life experience, leadership experience, and church involvement.

The **CertHE** is the ideal first step into university level theological study, with a focus on scripture, leadership, spiritual formation, and mission. It also acts as an introduction to further study with us at a higher level.

The **part-time BA(Hons) degree** offers a comprehensive and engaging study programme, designed for anyone seeking breadth and depth in their theological understanding. The creative and challenging range of modules on the BA will introduce you to cutting edge practices in mission and ministry, and to the riches of the Bible and church history.

The BA takes six years to complete. It is an ideal way to study for a degree whilst remaining in work, as it enables students to apply their learning in the sphere of influence that God has placed them in.

Graduate Diploma PROGRAMME GENERAL GRADDIP AND 2 SPECIALIST TRACKS TO CHOOSE FROM:

GradDip in Kingdom Theology

The **part-time Graduate Diploma** is designed to equip those who already hold degrees in subjects other than theology for Spirit-empowered life, leadership, and mission. This programme has three tracks: The **Graduate Diploma in Kingdom Theology** offers study of the major theological disciplines, including biblical studies, church history, spirituality, Christian doctrine, and leadership. This is a two-year programme, but students may choose to take a specialist vocational track in their second year for either **Student Ministry** or **Church Planting and Leadership**. Students can register on these tracks from the beginning of their studies or at the end of their first year.

Postgraduate PROGRAMME

MA in Kingdom Theology

The **part-time Hub-based MA**, which can be studied over 3 or 4 years, gives students the opportunity to explore the deep riches of biblical studies, systematic theology, Christian history, ethics, the contemporary church, and life in the Spirit. The MA programme has a distinct emphasis on the relevance of theology for all spheres of life. All students write a dissertation in their final year to complete this postgraduate programme.
